#### Service Officer

On July 1, 2024 the U.S. Department of Veteran Affairs awarded \$26.8 million in legal services grants to a total of 108 public and non-profit organizations to increase access for eligible Veterans who are experiencing or at risk of homelessness. If you are in need of these services, contact Jacksonville area Legal Aid, Inc. at appy@jaxlegalaid.org, 904-356-8371. The counties served in our area are Baker County, Clay County, Duval County, Nassau County and St. Johns County.

Veterans no longer need to pay for their first three outpatient mental health care and substance use disorder visits each calendar year through 2027 to assist in lowering out-of-pocket costs. This copayment exemption benefit goes back to June 27, 2023 and will end Dec 29, 2027. To be eligible, the outpatient visit must be with a qualified mental health professional at VA or VA's network of community care providers. The VA will automatically refund Veterans for any copays paid to VA on or after June 27, 2023 for these appointments, with no further action required by the Veteran.
